#### 1. Introduction

These rules apply to the SCSC series and are supplemental to the APBA General Safety Rules and the individual class and category rules that are in effect.

- 1.1. Resources:
  - APBA General Safety Rules
  - APBA Class and Category Rules

#### 2. SCSC Series High Point Season Champion

- 2.1. High point championships will only be awarded to classes participating in 60% of the scheduled series events. See Appendix A for current schedule. A minimum of four (4) race events ("events" consist of 2 consecutive days of cumulative racing) must occur in any season to award a Series High Point Championship.
- 2.2. To receive points towards the accumulated series high points, there must be at least three (3) bonafide starters in at least one heat for the day.
  - 2.2.1. Exception: KRR class must have at least two (2) bonafide starters.

#### 3. Membership

- 3.1. To be eligible for SCSC series high points or championships, participants must be annual members in good standing.
- 3.2. The SCSC membership year runs from January 1 through December 31.

#### 4. Championships

- 4.1. Prior to publishing the season's events schedule SCSC may, at the sole discretion of the SCSC Board of Directors, at a minimum select events to be held as the SCSC National Championship.
- 4.2. To be eligible for any championships:
  - 4.2.1. Both owner and driver must be full SCSC members in good standing. "Single event" memberships are not eligible to participate in a championship event.
  - 4.2.2. Boat or driver (dependent on class scoring system) must have competed in a minimum of two (2) prior SCSC events. Each individual day of racing constitutes one (1) event. Eligibility participation does not need to be contiguous.

#### 5. Racing Rules

- 5.1. General
  - 5.1.1. No heat of racing shall consist of a mix of capsule and open cockpit boats.
- 5.2. SE
  - 5.2.1. Maximum speed of 85.99 mph is allowed. A speed of 86.00 mph to 87.99 mph will be considered a "break out" speed and the participant will be accessed a 1-minute or 1-lap penalty. For the heat or main. A speed of 88.00 mph or higher will be a disqualification for that heat or main with no points awarded.

#### 5.3. KRR

5.3.1. Each participating team will contribute \$250 per event to a purse to be paid out to the Series High Point Champion.
